As you are aware, we are participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme this term. This is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.
