Class 1 Renovation News



We are excited to announce that a contractor has been appointed by the Rowan Learning Trust to carry out a renovation of Classroom 1. This classroom has been in continuous use since 1875 and is in desperate need of renovation. The Rowan learning Trust identified the need to make the interior of this classroom fit for purpose and reflective of the wonderful work that goes in there. While the daily provision is excellent for the children, we have never been happy with our crumbling plaster, decaying heating pipes and the many worn out aspects of the classroom, such as the ceiling and floor. We are grateful that the Trust has provided the financial backing for this important project.

The renovation will provide new toilets specifically for pupils in this class, new storage, modern, safe radiators and a ceiling with recessed lighting. While we seek to preserve aspects of the interior, we are also mindful of our duty to ensure that this classroom is fit for the next generation of young learners.

To facilitate the timely completion of this project, the children of Class 1 will have their provision moved to Classroom 4 and also make use of the hall during the last 20 school days of this term. The warmer days will also allow us to utilise our beautiful outdoor environment when appropriate.

We look forward to unveiling the finished classroom when it opens for the start of the term and welcoming our families back into the classroom. We will ensure that the project causes minimal disruption to the learning and operation of the school during these last few days of term.
