Academised schools like Whitley are typically inspected by Ofsted within three years of their conversion. Following the resumption of Ofsted inspections on 23rd September, Whitley received notification on Monday morning that we would be undergoing a full two-day, graded inspection commencing the following day. We would like to express our sincere gratitude to all members of the school community for their support and engagement throughout the inspection process. Now that the inspection has concluded, a report will be produced in around 6 weeks. As soon as the report is available, you will receive a copy.

Healthy Snacks Reminder


As a school, we are committed to ensure that children have the best possible start in life. For several years, we have upheld our Healthy Snack Policy, and we continue to communicate this regularly through meetings, newsletters, and on an individual basis.


Our policy is as follows:

- **Snack Provision**: Pupils in Reception are provided with a fruit snack at playtime, and this offer is continued throughout Key Stage I. Any remaining fruit is then distributed to Key Stage 2 classes and made available to any pupil who does not have a healthy snack that day. Fruit bowls are placed outside each class for this purpose.
- **Bringing Snacks from Home**: Children are welcome to bring a healthy snack from home if they wish. We recommend following the <u>NHS 'Change4Life</u>' guidance, which advises that snacks should be kept to under 100 calories. One snack is sufficient for this time of day.
- **Unhealthy Snacks**: If a child brings an unhealthy snack, they will be asked to return it to their bag and take it home. In such cases, we will offer a replacement snack in the form of fruit.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us promote healthy eating habits among our pupils. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher or Mr David.
