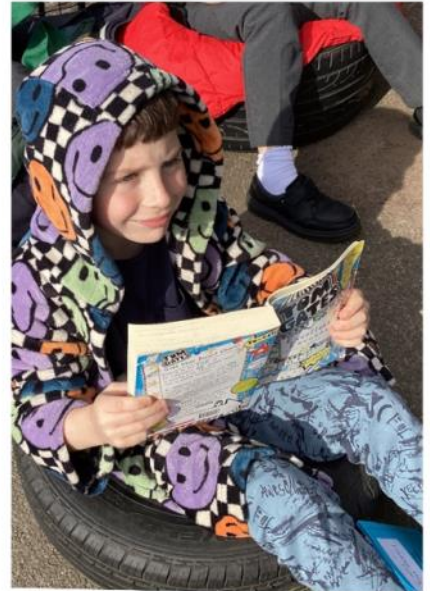


'Smile for a Mile'
